


OLORUNZAMI

The work of Nigerian artist Olorunyemi Kolapo is mainly on connections that human beings make or do not make through language, gesture, look, expression, physical placement, cultural values and more. The Abuja based selftaught artist marry art and science (physics) to investigate and illustrate emotions through portraiture using oil and charcoal with the science knowledge he gained after graduating with BSC in Applied Physics at the university. He has participated in both local and international exhibitions and residency programmes like World art Dubai, Art Expo New York, Last Image Show Tanzania, Malta-Nigeria Exchange Exhibition Malta and many more with four successful solo exhibitions.

Artist Statement

My work is about connections that human beings make or do not make through language, a gesture, a look, an expression, physical placement, cultural values, standards, emotions, and desires. Exploring how we communicate, accept, constrain, or reject these connections to form relationships is an evident theme throughout my work. My bodies of work are categorised similarly to how I live my life: processes, portraits, and conceptual pieces, or experiences, relationships and connections to others, and my inner, more consuming ideas and reflections on how moral and spiritual gauges are created within social, historical and instinctual contexts.

ADEO DAJ.





He studied Fine and Applied Art at Kwara State College of Education, he has been a full-time professional studio artist for the past 8 years and is also a member of Society of Nigerian Artists (Abuja Chapter). He has participated in a number of art competitions and exhibitions.

Artist Statement


ONOJASilus

He is a painter and his preferred medium is oil on canvas. He is a realism painter, who focuses more on realistic human figures.


His inspiration is from the amazing human anatomy, how and why the human figure is as it is.

ILOANYA wyekachukwu

Onyekachukwu was born in Onitsha, Anambra State, in 1990. He obtained a BA in Art Education, Fine and Applied Arts in 2013 from Nsukka University. He obtained his Masters Degree (MFA Sculpture) in the University of Benin in 2021.

He has participated in many group exhibitions, educational workshops and competitions held by local and international organisations including Ambassador Cup Image drawing competition, organised by the Embassy of China in Nigeria (won 3rd position) and Harmony, organised by National Gallery of Arts. His works engage social, political and cultural narratives of his immediate environment is Africa at large, employing basic shapes as his fundamental elements of arts for expression with strong stylistic influences from the cubic and post expressionist art movements. His teaching experience in the primary and lower secondary educational sector has influenced him in speaking for children through his paintings. He lives and practice art in Abuja.

Artist Statement

In Onitsha, where he grew up, he scavenged dump sites to recycle scraps into play toys. This act has turned to the artistic prowess of his works that he enjoys today by converting waste to aesthetic wealth.

His humble beginnings easily point and help his audience identify with the message of hope in his works. This becomes obvious in the expression of the subject matters and in the vibrant choice of colours expressed in his paintings. In conveying his message of hope, he equally embellishes his sculptures composed of discarded metal scraps with relishing tones of colours. In his artistic renditions, this artist often employs indirect method of metal scraps assemblage rather than the conventional direct method common among other sculptors. He believes that achieving healthier environment is the duty of all with the artists playing pivotal roles.







The Oba of Benin Metal 91.44cm (h) x 40.64cm (l) x 27.94cm (w) 2021

This piece is influenced by the current Oba (Monarch) of Benin, the Omon Oba N'edo Uku Akpolokpolor Oba Ewuare II, who is the 42nd Oba of Benin, crowned in December 2016. It depicts the royal culture of the Benin kingdom, both in rendition and embellishments. The work is in red colour to illustrate the land of Benin Kingdom. it is also an expression of the strength of the kingdom in keeping their cultural heritage. In Benin, the Obas are heavily adorned in beaded coral regalia from head to toe. These are symbols of royalty, authority, wealth and prestige.

Second Art

Oti-igba Metal 63.5cm (h) x 27.94cm (l) x 25.4cm (w) 2018

The sculpture portrays a drummer displaying energy, enthusiasm and skills. The idea of this piece is to support and promote African culture, it is inspired by the Igbo culture of music making, where young men take up the role of playing various cultural drums. Drumming in the Igbo traditional culture is a noble and major role in music making.

Third Art

Igue Festival Metal 147.32cm (h) x 43.18cm (l) x 33.02cm (w) 2018

Igue festival originally celebrates the Oba Ewuare's magical powers in the Benin Kingdom. One tradition states that the festival date coincided with the marriage of Ewuare and Ewere. Celebrated between Christmas and New Year, the festival includes the Oba's blessing of the land and his people. During the Igue ritual season, the Oba is prohibited from being in the presence of any non-native. During the festival, the Benin chiefs display there skills in dancing with the Ada n' Eben.
