Chike Emembo is an Abuja based fine artist with Christianity and faith as

his preferred genre. He started his training in 1998 enrolling in Nwafor Orizu College of Education Nsugbe, majoring in Sculpture and Graphics. He has a BA in Education from the University of Nigeria Nsukka. Since 2007, he started producing and exhibiting only works of art that are specifically

based on the Christian faith. These themes revolve around Christ, the Bible and the Church and are intended to encourage and strengthen the faith of the viewers.

In his paintings, priority is given to design, composition, drawing and texture, always seeking to outdo himself in every new piece. His recent body of work called The Seraphim series is an exploration seeking to understand angelic beings. He believes that angels are not only limited to celestial beings with wings but we can come across them everyday, we only have to 'open' our eyes to see them. That has informed the series with zippers, the zip is opening to reveal the ordinary person behind the wings. To buttress the point, the figures also have denims fitted into the composition, this he says gives it the modern contemporary feel. Beyond this angelic exploration, part of his recent works also includes the hearing of faith series. This shows various studies of people wearing headphones plugged into the Bible, he easily calls it faith comes by hearing. Nowadays, everyone is plugged into one device or another, what you listen to is either increasing or depleting your faith.

Chike enjoys producing artworks he feels strengthens faith whilst also offering great aesthetic appeal.




Kolapo OLORUNYEMI

galleries and privately.



Ezekwesili NNAEMEKA NNAM

Ezekwesili Nnaemeka Nnam is an abstract painter, sheet metal sculptor, upcycle artist, print maker and designer. The message of his ART is ABUNDANCE. He insists that we have abundant resources in everyone and in everything. We only need to find, exploit and use them. Ezekwesili works with several mediums including canvas, wood, bottles, sheet metal aluminum,

audio content, video content and discarded fashion waste. His work is primarly abstract, which allows him the leverage to present his ideas and extend meaning in his work. He loves to study origins, to audit root-ideas, uncover history and discuss the causes of things as we manage effects.

These causes, origins and ideas according to him, are found as seeds, blueprints, maps, foundations, sperms and eggs. His art admires and discusses the beauty in the cause of things, which are often small, sometimes insignificant, often occurs in secret, moves quietly and takes quite some time. He interrogates patterns, admires the power of foundations, their beauty and confidence evoking power. It is also about contributions, intimacy, teamwork and abundance. For him, the nitty-gritties and details are as powerful as the chaos or abundance they produce.

Ezekwesili's art is currently focused on the environment, waste management, upcycling and the message of the SDGs. He is the curator of UpcyclingX, a project that uses waste management education to contribute to a more sustainable world. He lives and works in Abuja, Nigeria, where he maintains a full-time studio.


In 2018, He began to embrace the experimental nature of lines, shapes, figures and colours to form

Ilouma Onyekachukwu




Onyekachukwu Anthony Iloanya, known as Onyeka, is a painter and a sculptor. He grew up in Onitsha, the commercial hub of Anambra State, Nigeria. There, he scavenged dump sites to recycle scraps into play toys. This act has turned to the artistic prowess of his works that he enjoys today by converting waste to aesthetic wealth.

His humble beginning easily points and helps his audience identify the message of hope in his works. This becomes obvious in the expression of the subject matters and in the vibrant choice of colours expressed in his paintings. In conveying his message of hope, he equally embellishes his sculptures composed of discarded metal scraps with relishing tones of colours.

In his artistic renditions, Onyeka often employs indirect method of metal scraps assemblage rather than the conventional direct method common among sculptors. Onyeka believes that we should all aim to achieve a healthier environment, with artists playing pivotal roles. He resides and practices his art in Abuja.
