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FOREWORD

Chike Emembo and I started working together on this exhibition at the beginning of 2021, from then on we thought about everything from the style of his latest works to the space where his works should be exhibited.

Taking care of everything with diligence was one of Emembo's priorities especially after his last individual exhibition in 2010. I have to say that the result is spectacular and the dedication to the theme of the exhibition is evident. All the research that he has invested is transmitted in each one of the works that belong to the exhibition, **Blackouts**.

The exhibition consists of 22 works that touch on theological themes interspersed with socio-cultural content. Some of the interesting points that the theme of this exhibition highlights is the importance of retelling history from an African point of view, not a Western one and bring to the surface what has been hidden for a long time.

As Mwalimu Julius Nyerere says "Africans all over the continent, without a word being spoken either from one individual to another, or from one country to another, looked at the European, looked at one another, and knew that in relation to the European they were one."

It is time for Africans to define themselves rather than compare themselves to something from the outside, and art events like **Blackouts** are a good opportunity to reflect and debate crucial arguments like this one.

The exhibition will be from Friday 24th to Sunday 26th June 2022 at Orisun Gallery, Abuja.

It makes sense as his father David is dark skinhead. He is dubbed to be very tactful and wise as you can see him closing up the game of chess. However, in the multitude of his wisdom and grandeur he played many women too (700 wives and 300 concubines) this led to him losing focus and inadvertently loosing half the kingdom albeit not in his time but in his son who succeeded him. You can see the game board folding up and all the pieces falling off. Therefore, while he played others he ended up playing up himself.

In true essence, David is described as being dark skinned in the holy books, but has been showed as light skinned over the centuries, so borrowing the classic structure of popular David's sculpture, the appropriate skin tone and age is rendered in the attributes of the subject.

Loving is an action word, it is not passive. You cannot say you love without backing up the statement with offering something, something that cost you something, something that holds value for you. The figure offers bread and wine which in Christian Dom represents blood and body the highest form of sacrifice done out of love as demonstrated with the flower it also presents with the other hand.

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Blackouts is a bold and courageous approach by Emembo to highlight visually, through his rich and deep use of colours, style and approach to project these experiences, imaginations and knowledge and the need to call to attention the role for us as Africans to rewrite history. Furthermore, we need to challenge the status quo, to liberate our minds and contribute to the discussion and expedition of the African renaissance and to promote the consciousness of being proud to be an African with the ideals and values that set us apart as a unique people.

This exhibition is a true tribute to the irrepressible African spirit, championed by the greats, such as Aina Onabolu, Ben Enwonwu, Lasekan, Grillo, Onobrakpeya... Chike Emembo is becoming one of the great!

One of the most popular theme of the Byzantine to the Renaissance eras is "the adoration of the Magi". Where The Three Wise Men traveled from the east (Babylon or Mesopotamia) to pay respect to a newborn king. This lends itself to the political state of Nigeria today, with special regards to the upcoming presidential election, with one particular candidate from the east generally touted to be the messiah, though everyone believes the big wigs and the corrupt system will not allow for easy passage. Much like the baby born as king but in a manger with seemingly poor chances of ever becoming king, he somehow managed to survive the odds just as everyone is looking up to The Three Wise Men from the east albeit with narrow odds.

The painting is blacked-out to show the hopelessness with the only colour in be square shaped reds, which stands for the red-capped chiefs from Eastern Nigeria.

ABOUT THE ARTIST



Chike Emembo is an Abuja based multi-disciplinary fine artist that uses his art to explore issues that border on faith, and spirituality. These broad themes are often brilliantly overlaid with socio-cultural axioms in a relatable contemporary fashion. He started his training in 1998 enrolling in Nwafor Orizu College of Education Nsugbe, majoring in sculpture and graphics.

He subsequently got his BA (Ed) from the University of Nigeria Nsukka. Since 2007, he started producing and exhibiting only works of art that are faith based.

These themes seeks to interrogate the status-quo on religious imagery in a manner that educates, encourages, uplifts and strengthens the faith of the audience. This increases the functionality of the work from not only being aesthetically appealing but also spiritually uplifting.

Chike is also the convener of **ARTASTE**: **the Plates and Palettes Project**, which is an annual travelling art exhibition, aimed at exploring alternative art spaces. The exhibition which will run its 9th Edition, sweeps through three select prime locations usually a restaurant in a space of three months bringing the artworks of great artists to people who need to see them and can afford to buy them. The show has held in Missouri Hotel, 805 Restaurant, Charcoal Grill, Waffle Stop and Signature Restaurant (all Abuja) and The Traffic Restaurant/bar in Ikoyi, Lagos. He loves to create this platform where not only his works will be seen but that of other artists, especially of female artists.

He was the Chairman of the Society of Nigerian Artists (SNA) Abuja in 2021, having previously served the SNA in various executive capacities. He is the art director at **Xchange Faces** and his works are highly sought after.

Artist Statement

Historically dark skinned people have been under represented in biblical iconography, I find it imaginatively conflicting to juxtapose obvious dark skinned subjects with inaccurate light skinned ones presented over the ages. Hence the need to tell our own story.

I approach the easel everyday consummating my passion for traditional figurative art with my interest in rocks and stones, giving birth to austere but relatable works with a dash exciting fun colours.


The works which usually spins off from social contexts, simultaneously amuses and interrogates preconceptions in biblical iconoclasm. Delivering this baby on a bed of " tile-like" square foam boards with a faux finish of white Carrara marble is nostalgic of my early work experience in a floor finishing company in Abuja.

It is important that we recognise the Bible as a multicultural book and accurately presenting the icons provides some form of acceptance and closure for the underrepresented.

Background story is the biblical account of how Noah planted a vineyard and got drunk after surviving the flood. The other tangents the work touches on is the wrong representation of Noah in the arts not just visual arts but also in the art of film making. According to the story, He was the father of Ham (whom is generally accepted as black) he certainly has to be coloured but he is at the bar now, perhaps miserable from losing his friends or burdened with repopulating the world and he gave in to drinking. It is indeed lonely at the top.



and bore the savior of the world. Given the society in which the story is set, girls are given out in their teenage years, hence the proper depiction of her age at that time of her life. Her gait and posture shows her fear and vulnerability, as she has to communicate to her betrothed husband how she got pregnant. She got a cape like a superhero to depict her bravery, not of physical strength but of character, faith and resolve.

Culled from the biblical story of Jesus entering amongst cheers into Jerusalem. They were cheering him in hopes that he will rescue them from the hands of their Roman colonizers, but instead of charging in with a horse, he strutted in on a donkey. Almost everyone, whom is successful, started small, whether it was raising a family or starting a business. You probably started out on a scooter, a cheering crowd might be there but you face your risks alone, as we know a few weeks after Jesus made that entry he was murdered and the same crowd that cheered him on joined to pull him down. On another tangent, the work also speaks of the global issue of migration, with Nigeria accounting for the highest numbers from Africa, which is why the work is in our national colours: green with pockets of white. The easterners have proven to be probably the most fluid in terms of movement as you see The Three Wise Men with their red caps among the crowd.

It was a popular sad love story of betrayal between Samson and Delilah. While people have vilified Delilah over the centuries, but in the story she was operating under duress, bearing threats from her relatives to destroy her family. That is why she is caught in contemplation before betraying her boyfriend. Perhaps not this grave but as individuals we always come to this point where we are cornered and have to run opportunity cost over our prevailing circumstances. Furthermore, it is important to define boundaries, apportion the appropriate level of commitment, and not just be entangled with anyone without establishing whether they be friends or foe.

Story has it that the woman David had his infamous adultery with was beautiful. The concept of beauty is as relative as they come, especially as regards seduction. She has been depicted by artists as slender without taking into account the taste buds of some other men. Hence her voluptuous size and a protruding stomach possibly from childbirth (at we were not told whether she has had a baby before or not). Married women with children can be sexy too and one should not expect that sparks would not fly just because she is married with kids. I hope that this irk will take a dig at the global subtle body shaming of women and inspire confidence in women to be comfortable in their own skin.
