The Theme: AFROTOPIA


Day by day the world hints to us that we will be living in a dystopian future rather than an utopian one. But we are hopeful there will be a turning point and the world will be a better place.

### Artist's Statement


My work is about connections that human beings make or don't make through language, a gesture, a look, an expression, physical placement, cultural values, standards, emotions, and desires. Portraits are a predominant part of my work as I am fascinated and challenged by the changes age, experience, the environment, climate, lighting, background, and just a slight muscle movement can make.

The concept of resilience is at the centre of current debates in development, climate change adaptation and humanitarian aid. However, it is not clear what resilience is, or how it can or should be promoted during and after crises, which is the centre of my work.




Awakening By Love 2021 | Oil on canvas | cm x 40.64cm

The process of developing my identity began with the discovery of myself, continued throughout my childhood and becomes the focus of my adolescence.

Identity is multidimensional and can include physical and sexual identity, occupational goals, religious beliefs and ethnicity. My teens explore these dimensions and are committed to significant aspects of identity as I moved into early adulthood. Periodically, adults can reevaluate and alter certain aspects of their network identity as life circumstances change and this begins with children's awareness that they are separate and unique individuals. The first signs of this awareness are evident in childhood, when children begin to recognise themselves. That is, they recognise the reflected image as themselves. Also, the words "I", "I" and "my" come up very early in children's language.



The Bashorun is a notable leadership position of the military in the old Oyo empire. The Bashorun can also be regarded as the prime minister. The Empire expanded to the utmost part covering the river Niger in the north; part of Tapa and Bariba kingdoms in the East of the lower Niger; towards the South by the seacoast and the West including Popos and Dahomey. All these countries including the Gas and Ashanti paid tributes to the Oyo empire. Thousands of provincial officials (called Ajeles) were appointed to administer all the conquered kingdoms and report to the Alafin who glory in his majesty and power. All these changed after the colonial masters came and invaded the Africa continent.

In my dreams, I saw the future, I saw the great Bashorun office returning with the full glory and ruling not just the Oyo Empire but down to southern America.

The office of Bashorun is no longer recognized and this is one of our many histories, values, culture and identity.


